CHRISTMAS TREE SNACK CAKE PLATE



MATERIALS

DB21426 Coupe Dinner Plate
Fan Brush
Medium Brush
Small Brush
Liner Brush
Paper Tree Pattern
Scissors
Water-based Marker
Straight Pin

COLORS

CMM 90 - Red Hot
CMM 29 - Grasshopper
CMM 67 - Snowflake
SG 704 - Speckta-Clear
Peppermint
Writer Bottle with CMM 90



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Thin down some Snowflake paint by adding 50% water to 50% paint. Use a fan brush to apply 2 coats to the top of the plate.
- 2. Use scissors to cut out the paper tree shapes.
- 3. Working one tree at a time, dip the paper into clean water and place it onto the plate. If you're going to write on the plate, make sure not to place a tree where you would like the writing to go.
- 4. Once you've placed all the trees, apply one more coat of watered-down Snowflake paint over the trees to make sure they're sealed down.
- 5. Use a fan brush to apply 3 generous coats of Grasshopper to the top of the plate, painting over the trees.
- 6. When the green paint begins to lose its shine, use a straight pin to remove the paper trees. Poke the pin into the paper and scoop the pin upward to release.
- 7. Use a writer bottle filled with Red Hot and make the lines on the trees. You can use the liner brush to smooth out the lines if you need to.
- 8. If you are going to add words, use a water-based marker to gently sketch the words. Then, use a liner brush to apply 2 generous coats of Snowflake.
- 9. When the plate is dry, apply one coat of Speckta-Clear Peppermint to the entire top of the plate.
- 10. When the top of the plate is dry, flip the plate over and apply 3 generous coats of Grasshopper to the back of the plate.
- ** This piece will not be dipped in a clear glaze after using the Speckta-Clear Peppermint. Make sure that all of the pottery is covered when completing each step.

TIPS

 If you do not have the Speckta-Clear Peppermint, you can achieve the speckled look by flicking on red and green spots using a stiff brush or a toothbrush. The piece will need to be dipped into clear glaze if not using the Speckta-Clear
